Gold Coast Light Rail Stage 2

RELOCATION OF PUBLIC UTILITIES - SMITH STREET AND NAPPER ROAD, PARKWOOD



From late-July 2016, CPB Contractors will begin works along areas of Smith Street and Napper Road, Parkwood as part of construction for the Gold Coast Light Rail Stage 2. These works are expected to take up to five months to complete.

Works will involve:

- Intermittent night works at the intersection of Napper Road and Smith Street.
- Temporary traffic flow changes and lane closures. Please drive to the conditions and follow traffic control
 and signage at all times.
- Potholing and identification of underground services using surveyors and a vacuum excavator.
- Public utility works including the relocation of services.
- Installation of safety fencing and barriers to contain work areas.
- Saw cutting of asphalt, excavation and road reconstruction.
- Concrete works including installation of formwork, pouring and concrete cutting.
- Delivery of equipment and materials throughout the work.
- Pedestrian access will be maintained around the construction areas.
- Timing of this work is subject to weather conditions and construction constraints.

Any impacts to utility services, such as communications, electricity, water or gas, will be managed by the service/utility provider and you will be notified of any service disruptions in advance.

Night work - relocation of public utility services

During the week commencing Monday 25 July 2016, night work will commence along sections of Napper Road and Smith Street to relocate public utility services to allow for the future construction of the light rail line. This work will be undertaken between 8:00pm and 6:00am each night and is expected to take two weeks to complete*.

These works must be undertaken at night when traffic volumes and demand for services are at their lowest. Traffic control and signage will be in place to assist and direct motorists.

Night work will involve:

- Temporary lane closures on Smith Street and Napper Road.
- The use of a vacuum excavator and light vehicles.
- Using temporary lighting towers to light the work areas.
- · Traffic control by Queensland Police Service, when required.

Every effort will be made to schedule the highest noise generating works to the earlier part of the evenings.

*Should weather delay these activities, they will be undertaken on the next available week night.

What to expect

- During these works, you may notice some changes around your local area such as construction vehicles, traffic management signs and personnel.
- Some noise, vibration and dust associated with the use of heavy machinery.
- Placement of temporary fencing around construction areas.
- Every effort will be made to keep disruption to a minimum for residents and businesses in close proximity to the project site. We appreciate your patience during these important works and will continue to update you as work progresses.

Project information

Gold Coast Light Rail Stage 2 involves the design and construction of a new 7.3km route which runs from Helensvale heavy rail station adjacent to the Gold Coast Line, then adjacent to the Smith Street Motorway to connect with Stage 1 at the Gold Coast University Hospital light rail station.

The Queensland Government and GoldLinQ finalised the Stage 2 project documents on 28 April 2016. GoldLinQ's construction contractor CPB Contractors commenced construction in July 2016.

GoldLinQ and CPB Contractors have committed to completing the project in time for the Gold Coast 2018 Commonwealth Games.
